I Thess. 2:4 tells us that God has graciously allowed us to be put in trust with the gospel and so we speak. God has extended a great favor and honor to us in putting the gospel into our trust. In listening to many of the so called “greats” in today’s “Christian arena”, I am hard pressed to hear a clear gospel. The gospel has been altered so as not to “offend”. God tells us in I Thess. 2:4 that we should speak “not as pleasing men.” We don’t want to fall into this temptation! We want to keep the power in the gospel by preaching the cross, man’s helpless condition and the blood of Christ as the only offering for sin that can save us.

Lesson 92 The Hope of the Gospel

Col. 1:23 “If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister;”

The “hope of the gospel”. Hope is a wonderful word. It infuses us with joy and anticipation.

In Heb. 6:19 hope is referred to as an _____ of the _____ both _____ and _____. A song was written with this verse in mind called, “My Anchor Holds.”

The word “hope” in our verse does not mean an expectation that we are somewhat unsure of. Something that might or might not happen, like, “I hope the sun shines tomorrow.” No, Paul uses hope in the Bible as a confident expectation in most places. He uses the word hope over 40 times.

The gospel is full of hope, (sure expectation).

Rom. 15:13 “Now the God of _____ fill you with all _____ and _____ in _____, that ye may _____ in _____, through the power of the Holy Ghost.” We have a God of hope who wants His people abounding in hope. Those Roman Gentiles must have been jumping for joy over Paul’s message of grace to them. They who were once “without hope” now were the beneficiaries of God’s riches in Christ! God had provided a way for Gentiles to be made nigh unto Himself.

We do not need to despair or lose hope because of the sufferings of this present time, no matter what form they take. We have a hope laid up in heaven. A sure expectation that will come to pass, all because we have Christ, our HOPE!

Col. 3:3, 4 "For ye are _____, and your _____ is hid with _____ in _____. Vs. 4 When _____, who is _____ shall _____, then shall ye also _____ in _____."

Yes, we shall appear, be made manifest with him in glory. Do we really believe this?? This glorious hope should vanquish our fears, settle our minds and still our hearts.

Rom. 8:24, 25 "For we are _____ by _____: but _____ that is _____ is not _____: for what a man _____ why doth he yet _____ for? Vs. 25 But if we _____ for that we see _____, then do we with _____ for it."

Our hope is out of our physical sight right now. But by faith, believing God's word concerning our hope, we know it to be a reality. This allows us to patiently wait no matter how rough the going is now, with confidence.

David speaks of the lack of satisfaction to be found in man or his riches in Ps. 39. "His days are short and his riches vanish. In vs. 7 David says "And now, Lord, what _____ I for? My _____ is in _____." David is saying that he has nothing to hope for in this world that is satisfying. David finds that his only comfort, happiness, and satisfaction comes by having his hope in God!

Our disappointments, our suffering, our defeats, our struggles should drive us to our hope. May we keep our eyes heaven-ward, our affection on things above, and our hope burning in our heart.
